

Hot and Humid July had Air Conditioners Running Hard

July 2025 saw a continued string of above normal temperatures combined with high humidity for the area. Versailles customers consumed a large amount of electricity during the month in the attempt to stay cool. For the month of July, electricity usage topped 8.5 million kWh for the entire Village system. This was the highest onemonth total ever in the Village in its 124 years history. July power demand was 14% more than June and 40% higher than May. Customers will notice the increased usage on their utility invoices that are due September 10th.

Refuse Large Items and Brush Collection



There has been an uptick in large refuse items such as recliners, appliances, and other such large household items being sat out at the curb in various locations without the customer calling the Village Utility Office to schedule a large item pickup. The Village will gladly collect such large items for \$10 (each item) by the customer calling the Village Utility Office at (937) 526-3294 with office hours being 7:30A-4:00P M-F. Customers may also email such requests to utilities@versaillesoh.com any time of the day. The cost for the large item pickup will be automatically added to your monthly utility bill. The Village also provides weekly brush collection service at the curb side of the customer every Friday at no cost to the property owner. However, you must contact the Village Utility Office to be added to the collection list as Village personnel do not run a street-by-street route for this free service. Brush collection is separate from the bi-weekly Yard Waste Collection Service. The Village is happy to provide these services to the residents of Versailles to help keep our community clean and appealing for the betterment of all.

Plan Ahead...

On Tuesday, October 7th, the Village of Versailles will conduct the final clean-up day of the year. This will be the last clean-up day until next spring for discarding medium sized items that will not fit in the Village refuse container. Please sit items out at your normal pick up location for pick up on the morning of October 7th. We hope to be able to pick up all items on this day, however, if we cannot finish all pickups that day we will pick them up the following day(s) until we are finished.

This fall clean-up day is intended for items that are too large to fit into the refuse container and would not normally require an additional charge to collect. Normal trash in your Village refuse container will still be picked up on your designated day that week. This pickup of medium items is in addition to your normal trash pickup!
